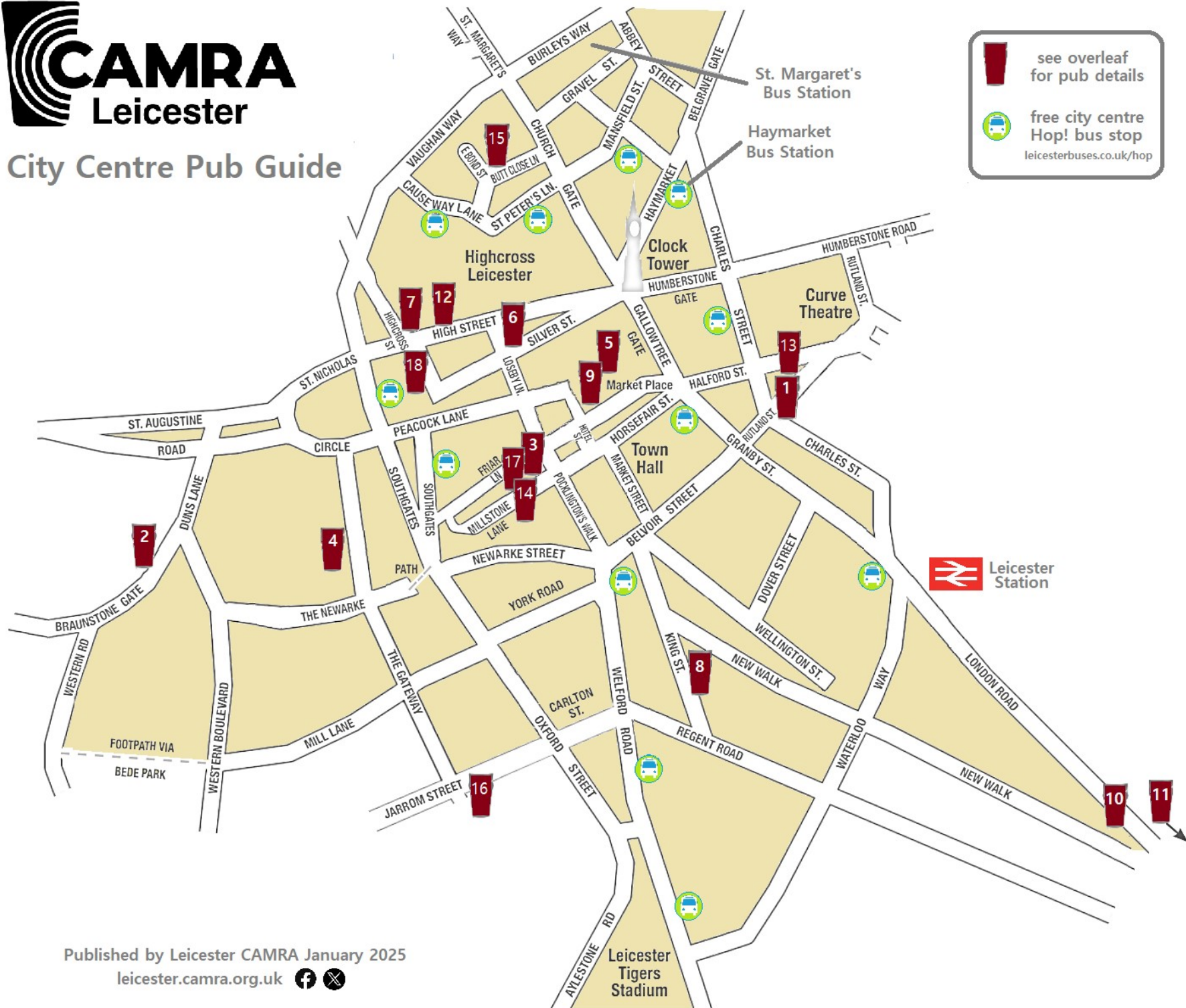

Run by the Hoskins family and a Good Beer Guide entry consistently for 25 years, this city centre pub has a 1930s interior including an original oak staircase. Two rooms with tiled and parquet floors and a central bar. Hoskins beers are brewed for them locally plus there are guest ales.		Traditional community pub with two rooms separated by a central bar. The wood-panelled walls provide an old fashioned setting and there is a modern roof terrace at rear for open air drinking. Beers from Everards Brewery with occasional guest ales. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry.		Micropub on the ground floor of a building in a conservation area. Single room with a bar opposite as you enter, with displays of old Leicester maps. Guest beers from breweries around the country include many rare beers. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry and local CAMRA Pub of the Year.		Conversion into a micropub of two tiny historic cottages close to the site of Leicester Castle in lovely old part of the city. The building had been unused since it was an antiques shop in the 1990s. Usually has a local beer plus two other interesting beers. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry.		The Corn Exchange was originally where farmers and merchants traded cereal grains. The present Grade II listed classical building built between 1850-1856 and is very much the focal point of Leicester's 700 year old market. Wetherspoon pub with large range of real ales.		An excellent traditional pub of great character with small snug area to the right of the entrance which still has gas lights. Some modernisation has taken place to the dining area. Card only payment. Beers from Everards Brewery with guest ales & ciders.

Grade II listed, this is the former High Cross Coffee House, built about 1895 and named after the cross marking the centre of medieval Leicester, which has been relocated-in nearby Jubilee Square. Wetherspoon pub with large range of real ales.		Traditional pub acquired by Black Country Ales in 2012 and was fully refurbished in 2017. Twelve handpulls serve seven regularly changing guest ales. It's open fire and roof terrace make it popular throughout the year with real ale enthusiasts. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry.		This pub was rebuilt in 1904 to the designs of local architect Stockdale Harrison and is a listed building. Refurbished and renamed in 2017, the interior has been rebuilt in clean modern decor and there is a patio facing a new square. Beers from Everards Brewery.		Historic pub with a richly decorated facade stands out on the busy London Road thoroughfare. Popular with students and local workers. The garden features heated beach huts. Card only payment. Beers from Everards Brewery with occasional guest ales & ciders.		Large nineteenth-century former coaching inn facing the huge Victoria Park. Outside seating at the front and behind the pub is the largest pub garden in Leicester. Beers from Everards Brewery with occasional guest ales & ciders.		Former furniture shop was converted to a large pub in 1999 and was refurbished and reopened as a free house in 2014. There is a small yard area at the rear plus a few seats at the front. Two real ales, often Shipstones, and a range of craft beers.

Unusually-shaped Grade II listed building built in 1888 and designed by local architect Stockdale Harrison. Now a micropub with an educational theme using old school furniture. Real ales and ciders are served by gravity from a chiller cabinet behind the counter. Card payments only.		This pub has an open plan interior with a contemporary ambience. Bar is directly facing the front entrance and there is a restaurant area on a raised level. Courtyard at rear with seating and spiral staircase leading upto a rooftop terrace. Beers from Everard Brewery with occasional guest ales.		Traditional street corner pub which was fully refurbished in 2023 by Black Country Ales, which saw the central bar relocated to open up space. The pub offers a selection of beers and ciders from twelve handpumps. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry.		An Everard's house since 1901 and refurbished in traditional style in 2013. There are two rooms with an attractive snug (a modern addition). At the back is a small covered alley with a few seats; then a very attractive new patio. Beers from Everards Brewery with occasional guest ales.		This small beer-orientated pub occupies a listed building built in the 1890's as a dwelling. Comfy modern interior and upstairs there are two attractive small rooms. Three handpumps serving beers from small breweries plus range of craft keg beers. 2025 Good Beer Guide entry.		Part medieval and part Georgian building opened as a bar/restaurant in 2017. Bar area has an old beamed ceiling and a long medieval timber-framed window. Two side rooms with fires. Large outside seating area. Four handpumps with changing beers including local breweries.
